EDUCATION

Helping children and youth achieve their potential through educational readiness.

Problem: Washington County students are not fully prepared for both kindergarten and beyond. This further contributes to inconsistent academic achievement toward college / career readiness.

- 24,419 Participants in education funded programs.
- 1,051 Volunteers gave 6,182 hours in support of these programs.
- Education Related Grants = \$128,624
- Value of Volunteer Time = \$157,208

This focus area is reporting on the first year of a three year grant.

FINANCIAL STABILITY

Promoting financial stability and independence through financial literacy.

Problem: Washington County has a high number of households experiencing financial instability and housing insecurity.

- 379 Participants in financial stability funded programs.
- 14 Volunteers gave 271 hours in support of these programs.
- Income Related Grants = \$94,694.89
- Value of Volunteer Time = \$6,891.53

This focus area is reporting on the second year of a three year grant.

HEALTH

Improving individual and family health, safety and security.

Problem: Washington County residents' health and well-being is adversely affected by high risk behaviors and abusive lifestyles.

- 3,225 Participants in health funded programs.
- 221 Volunteers gave 10,875 hours in support of these programs.
- Health Related Grants = \$131,404
- Value of Volunteer Time = \$276,551

This focus area is reporting on the third year of a three year grant.

BASIC NEEDS

Providing access to the basic needs of life.

Problem: A high number of Washington County residents are considered to be poor or working poor (41%) and should be provided access to critical assistance and support to overcome barriers.

- 364 Participants in basic needs funded programs.
- 1,910 Volunteers gave 16,302 hours in support of these programs.
- Basic Needs Related Grants = \$90,147
- Value of Volunteer Time = \$414,559.86
